

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The historic place 'Vasai' (Bassein) has been an important landmark from times in the distant past. Surrounded by the Sahyadri Mountains to the east, enriched by the alluvial soil of the Vaitarni this beautiful green belt is bordered by the boisterous Arabian Sea to the West. This area speaks volumes about human endeavor, toiling to reap the benefits from the green agricultural expanse – the hilly dense forests coupled with the wealth from the seas. Our college is ensconced in this secure rustic world which is fast changing into a modern industrial environment and lifestyle.

During the 1980's the Catholic community in and around Vasai felt the need of opening an institution of higher education. Since 1889 the Roman Catholic Church of Our Lady Of Grace, Papdy- Bassein has been involved to cater to the educational needs of the Catholic community.

Although Vasai had many important schools run by different organisations until the recent past, there were not any institutions of higher learning. Students from this area had to commute to Bombay city earlier to meet their educational needs.

This need, saw the public of Vasai Create a college in 1970's, but that was not enough to meet the emerging needs for higher education. In 1975 our college trust (Our Lady of Grace) opened the Thomas Baptista Junior College and in 1984 the St. Gonsalo Garcia College of Arts and Commerce saw the light of existence.

The foundation stone for the institution of higher education and excellence was laid by The Pope John Paul II on 9th Feb, 1986. Since 1984 the senior college had begun functioning at the premises of the Thomas Baptista Junior College. It was only in 1996 that the entire college administration and teaching shifted to the present campus. The College runs various programmes at UG and PG levels and have a research center in the subject of rural development. Another Building i.e. Building - II was inaugurated in January 2019. Presently the College caters to the needs of 3900 plus students across humanitiies, commerce, management and information technology.



## LIBRARY

The College Library has a spacious and well-ventilated reading room. It has a section of books on various subjects, which is continuously updated. The working hours of the Library are from 7.00 am to 3.20 pm on all working days except public holidays and Sundays. The Library has 48,895 books, 20+ Print journals & magazines, 20+ print newspapers. The Library has been automated with a fully featured open source Koha-Library management system. The library provides various facilities to students such as Reading Hall, Property Counter, Information Literacy Program, Internet Service, Remote access to E-resources, Reference Service, New Arrival Display Service, Current Awareness Service (CAS), Literature Search Service and Customized Academic Search Engine (CASE) with Dynamic Library Website.



## E-RESOURCES SERVICE

Library provides N-LIST and DELNET service for online e-resources of various streams. N-LIST (National Library and Information Services Infrastructure for Scholarly Content) provides 6000+ e-journals 1,99,500+ e-books access to students and Staff. Similarly, DELNET (Developing Library Network) provides access to millions of network library resources through DELNET. The library also provides information to students and staff through Indigenous platform Swayam. During Covid-19, Coursera courses were offered to students.

## CLASSROOMS

The college has 55 well equipped classrooms & 2 computer laboratories. Classrooms are equipped with LCD projectors and whiteboards.



## SEMINAR HALL

It is designed with state of the art facilities, LCD projector, Wifi connectivity, sound system etc. and can accommodate 110 people and is fully air conditioned. The Seminar Hall is a great asset for the institution as we can hold meetings, workshops and other academic programmes in this vibrant facility.



## AUDITORIUM

One of the main highlights of the College infrastructure is our Auditorium in the new building i.e Building 2. It has a seating capacity of 1000 People/Space. The auditorium features a stage, where all the cultural and educational events are showcased. There is also an open stage behind Building 1 and a huge open ground where cultural activities, social programmes and sports events are organized.

## CCTV

CCTV cameras are installed at various places in the College campus for the safety of the students, the property and facilities of the college thus enabling the smooth functioning of the college.

## COLLEGE GYMKHANA

A well-equipped gymkhana for well-rounded physical health of students and staff. It has equipment for indoor sports like Carrom, Table Tennis, Chess and Outdoor sports like Football, Volleyball, Kabaddi, Cricket, Athletics, Badminton, Basketball. We have an open air gymnasium equipments installed.



## RO WATER FACILITY

The college provides pure drinking water to its staff and students. We have installed R.O System on every floor in both the buildings.



## COLLEGE CANTEEN

The College infrastructure has a special area designated college canteen. It can accommodate 70 students and serves wholesome food in a hygienic manner.



## COMPUTER LABS

The College has well-equipped air conditioned computer labs for BCom and BsC IT programs. The B Com Computer lab is equipped with 20 machines and Bsc IT lab is equipped with 50 machines with internet connectivity and facilities such as projectors.



Teachers provide curricular & co-curricular guidance to students, Mentors are in touch with students via mentorship, contributing to student's friendly campus.

In order for the overall growth of students, college favours students participation in various cultural/sports activities at college & University level with required infrastructure.

Students are encouraged to contribute towards development of society & for conservation of environment via tree plantation drives & cleanliness drives.

The College has associations with NGOs thus building the spirit of communal services by organising blood donation camps & other service activities.

Parents and students are requested to go through the prospectus, admission notices and circulars available on the University of Mumbai website ([www.mum.digitaluniversity.ac](http://www.mum.digitaluniversity.ac)) and College Notice boards, the College website ([www.ggcollege.ac.in](http://www.ggcollege.ac.in)) before seeking admission in college. The Principal reserves the right to amend or modify the rules regarding admission, if and when any amendments/revised guidelines are received from the University, Government or the Management. The Principal also reserves the right to refuse admission, if in his/her opinion, such an admission is likely to adversely affect the overall discipline of the College.

Admission preference will be given to students who have fulfilled the eligibility and qualification criteria in the preceding academic year. All the rules regarding the reservations wrt to the minority institutions will be adhered to.

Admission process for FYBA, FYBCom / FYBMS /FYBBI / FYBAF & FYBSC- IT Courses as follows:

1. All the admissions are online and as per the University schedule as mentioned in the University website.
2. The students should visit the University Website ([www.mu.ac.in](http://www.mu.ac.in) or [www.mum.digitaluniversity.ac](http://www.mum.digitaluniversity.ac)) open the link "Admissions" or "Admissions to FY Courses to display the Pre-admission Enrollment Form, fill in the required details of Courses and take the printout. This step is mandatory.
3. After completion of this step you will have to visit the college website ([www.ggcollege.ac.in](http://www.ggcollege.ac.in)) Go to the home page and click on "Apply on UG/ PG Admissions" And follow the given instructions.
4. The students are required to fill in the College Admission Form and select the subjects or group of subjects as per their choice, the details of which are given in the College Prospectus.
5. The students must apply separately for each course, if he/she desires
6. Pre Admission - The student must submit the following in the College Office
  - (a) Duly filled in printout of the Pre-admission Enrollment Form downloaded from the University Website, and
  - (b) Duly filled in the College Admission Form. He/she will receive token/receipt, which will be required for confirming his/her Admission after the Merit ListNOTE: No originals or photocopies of documents need to be submitted at this stage
7. The merit list will be put up and displayed by the College as per the University of Mumbai schedule.
8. Admission Confirmation:

If a student's name appears in the College merit list, then he/she must immediately contact the College office to confirm the admission. For this he/she must carry

  - (a) Admission Token/Receipt,
  - (b) Original documents with the required number of photocopies, andOn verification by the Admission Committee, the student should pay the required amount of fees in the Accounts Office and receive the Fee Receipt as the confirmation of admission. The original Fee Receipt must be carefully preserved.

9. If the student fails to confirm his/her admission as stated above, his/her name will not be considered in the subsequent merit lists.

Important: All admissions are provisional and done strictly on merit basis. The admission is confirmed on the basis of submission of original documents, scrutiny and approval of Admission Committee and payment of full amount of fee. The College charges no Donation and no Capitation Fee for admission

Note: The Admission Forms for FY courses and the prospectus are also available on the college website ([www.ggccollege.ac.in](http://www.ggccollege.ac.in)), for reference hard copy of the same will be issued at pre-admission.

## Documents Required

1. Printout of duly filled online Pre-admission Enrollment Form downloaded from the University Website.
2. Duly filled in College Admission Form.
3. Original Std XII Marksheet with 3 (Three) photocopies.
4. Original Junior College Leaving Certificate with 1 (One) self-attested photocopies One self-attested photocopy each, of the Std X Marksheet and Passing Certificate.
5. Provisional Eligibility Certificate (Applicable for students from other than Maharashtra State Board)
6. Migration Certificate (Applicable for students from other than Maharashtra State Board)
7. One self-attested photocopy each, of Aadhaar Card and PAN Card
8. Two passport size photographs of the student (Frontal view of the full face against white background).
9. GAP Certificate (Joint Affidavit) of the student and either of the parents on a 100/ stamp paper, if there is a break of more than a year in the academic career after passing Std XII (Draft of GAP Certificate will be provided).

## Faculty of Arts

### Bachelor of Arts (B.A.)

A candidate for being eligible for admission to the three year integrated course leading to the degree of Bachelor of Arts must have passed the Higher Secondary School Certificate (Std. XII) examination conducted by the different Divisional Boards of the Maharashtra State Board of the Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary education with the following subjects:

1. English
2. Any one of the Modern Indian Language or Modern Foreign languages or Information Technology.
3. Any four subjects carrying 100 marks each.

**OR**

Must have passed the Higher Secondary school Certificate (Std. XII) examination with vocational subject conducted by the different Divisional Board of the Maharashtra State Board of Secondary Higher Secondary Education with the following subjects-

- English
2. Any one vocational subject carrying 200 marks prescribed by the Board from time to time
3. Any three subjects carrying 100 marks each.

**OR**

Must have passed the Higher Secondary School Certificate (Std. XII) examination with the Minimum Competency based Vocational course conducted by the different Divisional Boards of the Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education with the following subjects:

1. English
2. Any one of the Modern Indian Language or Modern foreign languages or Information Technology
3. General Foundation Course
4. Any one subject carrying 300 marks from among the Minimum. Competency based vocational course prescribed by the Higher Secondary School Certificate examination from time to time.

OR

Must have passed an examination of another University or Body Recognized as equivalent thereto (Various combinations available to B.A. degree is mentioned elsewhere in this prospectus)

## **M.A. (Rural Development)**

A candidate for being eligible for admission to the course leading to the degree of Master of Arts must have passed the examination for the degree of Bachelor of Arts (Three year integrated course) of this University or the degree of Bachelor of Arts (Old that is four year course) of this University or a degree of another University recognized as equivalent thereto. Provided, however, that applications of graduates of this University in the faculties other than the faculty of Arts, or those who have passed the equivalent examination of another recognized University seeking admission to the M.A. degree course by papers, will be considered on the basis of fulfilling certain conditions. (For more details please contact the department.)

## Faculty of Commerce

### 1. Bachelor of Commerce (B.Com.)

0.2152 A candidate for being eligible for admission to the three year degree course leading to the Bachelor of Commerce must have passed the Higher Secondary School Certificate (Std. XII) examination conducted by the different Divisional Boards of the Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education.

OR

Must have passed the Higher Secondary School Certificate (Std.XII) examination with vocational subjects / minimum competency based vocational course conducted by the different Divisional Boards of the Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and higher Secondary Education.

OR

Must have passed an examination of another University or Body recognized as equivalent to Higher Secondary School Certificate (Std. XII) Examination.

### Bachelor of Commerce (Accounting & Finance)

- a) A candidate for being eligible for admission to the Bachelor of Commerce (Accounting and Finance ) degree course shall have passed XII Std. examination of the Maharashtra Board of Higher Secondary Education or its equivalent and secured not less 45% marks in aggregate at first attempt (40% marks in case of Reserved Category).
- b) Every candidate admitted to the degree course in the constituent/ affiliated college/ recognized institution, conducting the course shall have to register himself/ herself with the university

### Bachelor of Commerce (Banking & Insurance)

A candidate for being eligible for admission to the Bachelor of Commerce (Banking and Insurance) degree course should have passed XII std. examination of the Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education, Pune or its equivalent and secured not less than 45% marks in aggregate (40% in the case of reserved category candidates) at one and the same sitting. Every candidate admitted to the degree course in the affiliated colleges conducting the course shall have to register enroll himself/herself with the University.

## **Bachelor of Management Studies (B.M.S.)**

A candidate for being eligible for admission to the B.M.S. Degree Course shall have passed H.S.C. examination of the Maharashtra Board of Higher Secondary Education or its equivalent examination or Diploma in any Engineering branches with two years or three years duration after S.S.C. conducted by the Board of Technical Education, Maharashtra State or its equivalent examination by securing minimum 45% marks for general category (in one attempt) at the respective Examination and minimum 40% marks for the reserved category ( in one attempt). Admissions are purely based on Merit. While drawing the merit list, weight age has to be given to students from Arts, Commerce and Science Stream at 12th standard level. The stream wise weight age to be given is as under:

STREAM	COMMERCE	ARTS	SCIENCE	D I P L O M A I N ENGINEERING AND OTHER
PERCENTAGE	45%	25%	25%	5%

The applications are to be accepted and processed by the colleges stream wise separately and the merit list is to be displayed stream wise taking into account the reservation policy prescribed by the Government of Maharashtra.

- The merit list is to be prepared and displayed stream wise.
- In case if no applications are received under the Diploma in Engineering and other Category or if the seats remain vacant in Diploma in Engineering and other Category after all the merit lists/ forms are exhausted, the vacant seats must be transferred to Commerce Stream.
- In case if not application is received from any stream the vacant seats are to be distributed equally between the remaining two streams only.
- After the first merit list is displayed, if any seat allotted to one stream remains vacant, the same shall be distributed equally between the remaining two streams. In case of vacancy in one stream is of single/odd number of seats, the single seat is to be allotted to the Commerce Stream. In case if no applications are available from the two streams, then all the vacant seats of such two streams must be transferred to the third stream.
- Step(d) be repeated for the subsequent merit lists till all the forms are exhausted or the final merit list is displayed, whichever is earlier.

## **Master of Commerce (M.Com.)**

A candidate for being eligible for admission to the Master of commerce course, shall have passed the examination for the degree of Bachelor of Commerce of this University ( three years integrated course) of the degree of B.Com. ( Old course) of this university, or Bachelor of Commerce ( Accounting and Finance) or B.Com ( Banking and Insurance) or B.Com (Financial Markets) or B.M.S. degree examination or an examination of any other University recognized as equivalent there to.

## Faculty of Science

### **Bachelor of Science (Information Technology) B.Sc. (IT.)**

- a) A candidate for being eligible for admission to the Bachelor of Science - Information Technology, shall have passed XII standard examination of the Maharashtra Board of Higher Secondary Education or it's equivalent with Mathematic and Statistics as one of the subject and should have secured not less than 45% marks in aggregate for open category and 40% marks in aggregate in case of Reserved category candidate.
- b) Candidate who have passed Diploma (Three years after S.S.C-Xth Std.) in Information Technology / Computer Technology / Computer Engineering / Computer Science / Electrical, Electronics and Video Engineering and Allied Branches / Mechanical and Allied Branches / Civil and Allied branches are eligible for direct admission to the Second Year of the B.Sc. (I.T.) degree course. However, the Diploma should be recognized by the Board of Technical Education or any other recognized Government Body. Minimum marks required 45% aggregate for open category candidates and 40% aggregate for reserved category candidates.

### **M.Sc. Degree course - Information Technology**

All the admissions will be on merit (i.e percentage of aggregate marks secured for the qualifying examination). The candidate must have passed B.Sc. Degree in Information technology of University of Mumbai or any recognized Universities with minimum 45 percent of marks.

**OR**

B.Sc. in Computer Science / BCS with minimum 45% marks or B.E. degree in any branch with minimum 45% marks or B.Sc. (Mathematics) with minimum 45% marks or B.Sc. (Physics) with minimum 45% marks or B.Sc ( Statistics ) with minimum 45% marks or B.Sc. ( Electronics) with minimum 45% marks.

1. All applications for admission to any undergraduate or post graduate class should be submitted as per the dates notified by the university. Late applications may not be accepted.
2. As soon as the applicant is notified that admission has been offered to him/her, the full fees become payable. Until such payment is made or allowed by the Principal to be deferred in full or part, the offer of admission is liable to be cancelled.
3. All admissions, both of undergraduates and post graduates are valid only for a year, and are, therefore, to be renewed for each subsequent year of study.
4. In case of withdrawal or failure to attend college, the refund, if any, of the fee already paid will be in accordance with the following rules laid down by the University.
5. The college admission fees accept via cashless method. Students & parents can pay the admission fees via QR Code.

## Ordinances relating to the refund of all fees:

### 0.2859 Refund of Tuition, Development and All other fees after cancellation of admissions:

The candidates who have taken admission in aided and unaided courses conducted by affiliated colleges and in recognized institutions may request for refund of fees after applying in writing for cancellation of their admission to the course. The refund of fees as applicable shall be made on or the 30th day the date of cancellation. The percentage of fee for the course shall be refunded to the candidate after deducting charges as follows :

The entire fee is charged for the term for which a student's name has been entered on the College rolls, no account being taken of partial or even total failure of attendance. No fee, however, is charged for the second term if written notice of withdrawal from the College is received before the opening of the term.

A limited number of deserving students will be received at a reduced fee, but the actual number and amount in each case rests with the Financial Aid Committee.

## A.T.K.T. (Allowed To Keep Terms)

1. A learner shall be allowed to keep term for Semester II irrespective of number of heads of failure in the semester 1.
2. A learner shall be allowed to keep term for Semester III- if he/she passes each of Semester I & Semester II  
OR
3. A learner who fails in not more than four courses of Semester I and Semester II taken together with not more than two courses each in semester I & II.
4. A learner shall be allowed to keep term for Semester IV irrespective of number of heads of failure in Semester III.
5. A learner shall be allowed to keep term for Semester V if he/she passes Semester I, Semester II, Semester III and Semester IV  
OR
6. Shall have passed Semester I and II in full and secured ATKT in the Second year by failing in not more than Two Courses in each of Semester III and Semester IV.

OR

7. Shall have Secured ATKT in First Year by failing in not more than Two Courses in each of Semester I and Semester II and have passed Semester III and Semester IV in full.
8. A learner shall be allowed to keep term for Semester VI irrespective of number of heads of failure in the Semester V.
9. The result of Semester VI shall be kept in abeyance until the learner passes each of Semester I, Semester II, Semester III, Semester IV and Semester V.

## Re-valuation

As per University Circular No: Exam NCD/College (RefNER) 1603 of 2005, dated September 29, 2005 students are allowed to get photocopies of their answer books by submitting the prescribed application and paying fees of 100/- (Rupees One Hundred only) per answer book. Students can make such application not later than (One) week of declaration of result. Students will receive a photocopy of answer book(s) after 10 (Ten) days from the date of payment of Revaluation Fee

If a student desires, he/she can apply for revaluation with the photocopy of answer book through a prescribed form and by paying fees of 500/- (Rupees Five Hundred only) per paper/ answer book

## ICC

Internal Complaints Committee (ICC) as under is constituted to deal with the complaints relating to sexual harassment at workplace. Our college is committed for providing safe academic and working environment to all students and its women employees. In pursuance of "UGC (Prevention, prohibition and redressal of sexual harassment of women employees and students in higher educational institutions) Regulations 2015" and as per the directives issued by Maharashtra State Commission For Women (MSCW), our college college constituted ICC.

**Punctuality and attendance:** Students must attend lectures, practicals and tutorials according to the timetable of their respective classes regularly. They must appear for all the college examinations (practical and theory). Absence from any of the examinations or unsatisfactory performance will lead to the loss of terms and detention. Every student has to complete the course of study prescribed for the examination for which he/she is studying, including tutorials, to the satisfaction of the Principal. The minimum attendance required for each term is 75%. Failing to be present for 75% of classes will result in strict action or the student may be detained. A student remaining absent for three lectures in a row, will not be allowed in class unless parents meets the concerned subject teacher/s with an explanation.

**Identity Card:** After admission, each student will be given his/her identity card which must be worn by the student throughout the stay in the College premises. Entry to the College premises, lectures, practicals, College functions or access to the Library, College Office, Laboratories, Canteen and Gymkhana is strictly based on the valid identity card.

**Dress Code:** Students are expected to wear modest clothes that contribute to the academic atmosphere necessary on an Indian College campus. Accordingly, wearing short tops, tank tops, short dresses, mini skirts, shorts, ripped jeans are considered inappropriate and should not be worn.

**Conduct and discipline:** Students must not loiter in the corridors when classes are going on. Students must read and follow the notices displayed on the notice boards from time to time. Ignorance of any information put up on the notice board will not be accepted.

If, for any reason, the continuation of a student in the College is in the opinion of the Principal, detrimental to the interests or discipline of the College, she/he may dismiss such a student from the College without assigning any reason for her/his decision which shall be final.

Insubordination and unbecoming language or misconduct are sufficient reasons for suspension or dismissal of a student. Students shall not communicate any information to the press/media about the matters concerning the College administration. Students are not permitted to bring outsiders into the College campus without prior permission. No society must be formed, no meeting must be held and no person should be invited to address the students in the College without prior permission from the Principal. Students applying for any certificate, testimonials, concession forms etc. and those requiring the Principal's signature on any kind of document or application should contact the College Office at least 2 (Two) days in advance. Students should not bring any papers directly to the Principal for signature.

- 5. Respect for College property:** Students are expected to take proper care of the College property and cooperate in keeping the premises clean. Any damage to the College building or property by disfiguring walls, tables, benches, doors or breaking furniture, apparatus, fittings etc, is a breach of discipline and will be strictly dealt with, imposing penalty, suspension or dismissal.

Smoking, chewing of tobacco, narcotics, paan and spitting is strictly prohibited in any part of the College building, including the canteen. This is a punishable offence under the Mumbai Police Act.

Drinking and eating is strictly prohibited in classrooms. Use of mobile phones and I Pods are strictly prohibited in the classroom. If a student is found using mobile phones or I-Pods during the lectures the gadget will be confiscated and not be returned.

## **7. Library:**

In our college library is central and common to all the academic activities. The library provides a place to study and get material and services that assist study. Its facilities and services exist solely for the benefit of the students and the staff. The regulations governing the use of the library have been implemented. The rules are devised to ensure that the best service is provided to all the stakeholders of the institution..

- 1) The college library is open for the students and members of the teaching and non teaching staff from 7.00 a.m. to 3.20 p.m. from Monday to Saturday. The library services are not provided on Sundays and Public Holidays. During the college holidays (Vocation), the library is fully functional.
- 2) The library provides open-shelf facilities through which students can go to the book shelves and select the books that they wish to read...
- 3) Books are issued strictly in order of application. It is left to the discretion of the librarian not to issue certain books when circumstances warrant it.
- 4) User Tracking System: While entering the Library, the user has to scan her/his valid Identity Card/Library card at the Library Entrance Gate through the Barcode Reader. It is not allowed for the readers to carry their private books and personal belongings inside the library.
- 5) Safety Security: The readers may keep their bags and belongings (except valuable items such as money, passport, credit/debit cards mobile phones, laptops, etc.) at the Property Counter in the Library.
- 6) No books or periodicals are to be taken out from the library unless they are issued on your account.

- 7) The books in the library are divided into the following categories :
- I) Reference Books: These include Encyclopedias, Dictionaries, Atlases, Multi-volumes, Art Books, etc. which cannot be borrowed at home.
  - II) Temporary/ Overnight Reference Books: Usually, one copy of every title is kept in demand for use in the library each day, at least until noon, then the borrower may take the book overnight, returning it the next morning.
  - III) Non-fiction Books: Books not in current demand may be taken for two days, three days and one week to two weeks.
  - IV) Periodicals, files and projects are to be used only in the library.
- 8) Students can borrow one textbook at one time for 7 days. A penalty of Rs.1/- per day will be levied on the delay of returning/renewing the issued books. Students must on receiving a book, examine it and report to the clerk any damage found therein, if they fail to do so, they are held responsible for any damage that is detected later.
- 9) Books lost, damaged or defaced must be paid for by the reader in whose name they were issued. The value of the books will be assessed by the Librarian.
- 10) Ex-students of the college can become members of the library. No books are allowed to be issued home. However, ex-students can read books in the library. Photocopy of certain sections of a book is permitted.
- 11) Silence is to be maintained in and around the reading room areas of the library.
- 12) Students are requested not to upset the order of the arrangement of books in the cupboards.
- 13) Smoking, eating and chewing gum, listening to Music / Use of mobile phones are not permitted in the library.
- 14) Furniture must not be rearranged and may only be used for its proper purpose, e.g. no sitting on or resting feet on tables.
- 15) Litter must not be dropped on the floor.
- 16) Students are not allowed to use cell phones in the lecture halls and in the administrative building.
- 17) Disregarding Library rules, indiscipline and misbehavior will render students liable to be refused access to the Library.
- 18) Regarding all matters concerning the librarian's word is final. The Librarian reserves the right to recall any book or periodical at any time.

## 8. CODE OF CONDUCT:

The College expects every student to strictly abide by the following Code of Conduct at all times

### 1. Identity Card (ID)

Students must have their identity card duly filled in and signed.

Students must wear their identity card when they are in the College premises.

Transfer of ID cards is a criminal offence. The student will be liable for expulsion from the College for such an offence.

2. Littering in the classrooms, corridors and the campus is prohibited. Please use the dustbins provided all around. Offenders will be penalized.
3. Sitting on the vehicles in the College compound is strictly prohibited.
4. Loitering or crowding is prohibited. Students are required to remain in the College campus during their free hours.
5. Mobile phones if carried by the students should be switched off while in classroom, library and corridors of the College. If these instructions are not followed, the instrument will be confiscated and the concerned student will also be charged a fine.
